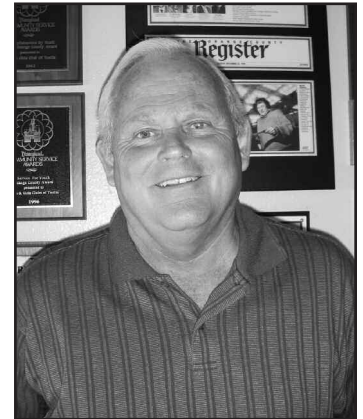
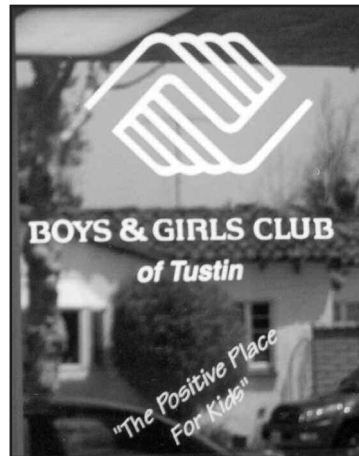

## MEMORIES OF TUSTIN

The 1959 arrival of The Jabberwocky in Tustin introduced Tustin to the rest of Orange County.

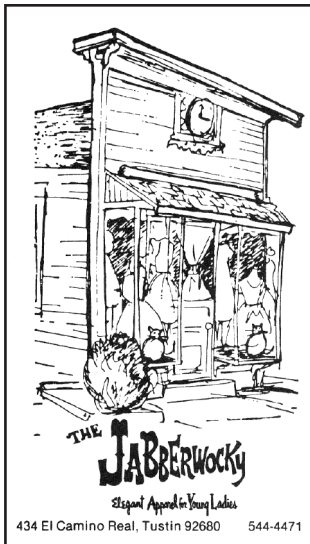
Starting April 18, 1959, Tustin became a destination for teenage girls looking for prom gowns, graduation dresses and for a chance to become models in our fashion shows. The Jabberwocky building was almost 100 years old then, but the clothes were the epitome of teenage fashion.

Being selected as models for our many fashion shows, which took place at high schools in Anaheim, Garden Grove, Fullerton, Newport Beach, Orange, and Santa Ana, brought hundreds of new customers to Tustin.

Graduation, prom and back-to-school were the inspiration for most shows. Our back-to-school show in 1959 inaugurated the Tustin Youth Center, which at the time was the major project of local activists, spearheaded by Maureen Rischard and Eugene Jacobson, who developed Tustin Square. (Most Tustin functions were held there, including the Miss Tustin contests, until the new City Hall and Community Center were built.)

Over the years Jabberwocky fashion shows were held at the Curtain Call Theater, The Jamestown Village Theatre, the Knights of Pythias Hall, the gazebo at Stevens Square, the Tustin Community Center and even the Tustin City Council Chambers—and of course, at all the junior high schools and both high schools in Tustin. Often we had “personal appearances” by prominent recording artists. One time we even had the Beach Boys at the Jamestown Theater.

Everywhere I go today I run into women who at one time were Jabberwocky models, and who remember the experiences fondly.

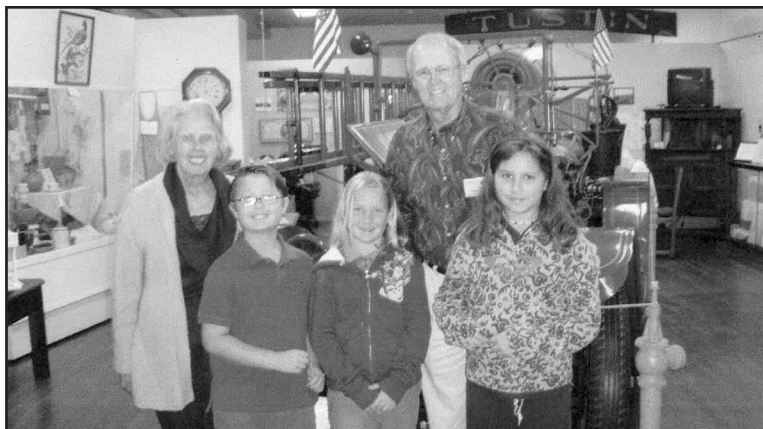

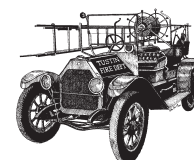
